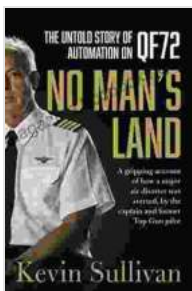


No Man's Land: A Journey into the Heart of Darkness

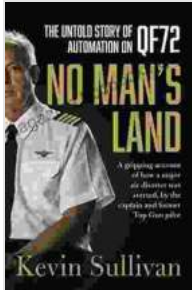

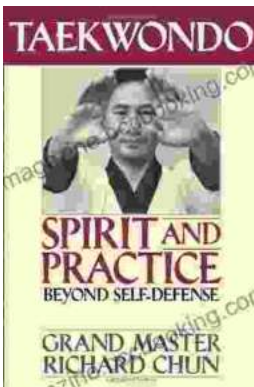

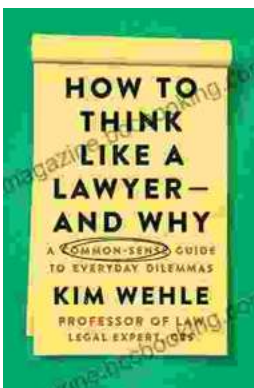
